

Gym Shoes

Welcome to all new families and welcome back to all returning families! All Eagle View students participate in physical education classes with Ms. Houldsworth on a weekly basis (2-3 times a week), in the gym. As not every classroom teacher requires students to wear indoor shoes, it can be difficult to ensure children are wearing appropriate footwear for PE and that the gym floor is kept clean (especially on rainy days). It would be very helpful if your child had a clean pair of runners at school to use in the gym and/or as their permanent indoor shoes. If a student has filthy shoes, high heels, flip flops, or shoes that are deemed otherwise unsafe for PE, they will be asked to participate in bare feet as socks are slippery and unsafe. Your help in this matter would be greatly appreciated! Thank you!

PACK IN PACK OUT LUNCHES

Back to school, the fun of seeing friends, new and old, back to learning, new classes and teachers and back to making lunches. This task can quickly become tiresome however this small act everyday can have far reaching effects on both the health of children and our planet.

Eagle View Elementary has adopted the "Pack in Pack out" format for lunch waste. This is an excellent opportunity to look at the amount of waste your child brings home. The ultimate goal is to become waste free and not have any waste come home. But goals all begin with a first step... here's some ideas you may already be doing or may want to start with your family on the path to a "Litterless Lunch".

- Try buying lunch containers with little compartments that can be filled. It doesn't take much time to put foods into reusable containers and you'll save more on resources, both food and money, in the process
- ♦ Pack a reusable water bottle for your child's drink.
- Get your kids involved! Young children love helping in the kitchen measuring, pouring, mixing, etc.

 Try to make to time to let them pack their own lunch (<u>lunchwithoutwaste.com</u>)
- When lunch waste comes home, recycle it in your blue box/compost. If there are soft plastics or foil, you can save them and recycle them at your local Pacific Mobile Depot
 (www.pacificmobiledepots.com)

Going greener is not always more convenient, but every small act leaves a lighter footprint on the earth. Begin with that first step and eliminate just one plastic bag or juice box every day. Once you do that, take the next step and make another change. This will benefit your child and the school, their food will be more nutritious and you will be role modeling some excellent habits, as well as making a difference for the planet.
