Student Class Placement 2017 - 18 School Year

Throughout the school we have been assessing students, collecting information and implementing strategies to meet the needs of all learners. Through a comprehensive collaborative process staff is at the beginning stages of organizing students into potential class groupings. Our goal is to place each student in the 'best' learning environment based on the variables listed below.

Many considerations go into decisions regarding placement of students. Specific criteria include but are not limited to:

- Range of learning needs
- Groupings appropriate for the best learning environment for all students
- Students' general developmental level, effort, independence, and achievement.
- Specific learning strengths, challenges, and styles
- Academic, social, emotional and behavioral needs
- Students' needs for learning support and/or special education services
- Gender balance
- Parental input

Parents may inform the principal in writing of any particular placement requests. During the placement process, administration and teachers review parent placement requests regarding the statement of their child's needs, **not** as a request for a particular teacher.

In fact, requests for a particular teacher by parents can interfere with the staffs' attempts to achieve balanced, heterogeneous groupings. Please understand although a letter is received, reviewed and discussed, this does **NOT** predetermine a child's placement nor guarantee a placement request.

In order to be fully considered during the classroom organization process meetings, a written request needs to be in the school office no later than **Friday**, **April 21** as we begin the placement process the following week.

All students with or without parent input will be given equal time and consideration in the placement process. Please note, the Principal, in accordance with the School Act of B.C. will make the final decision about student placement and school organization.

HAVE YOUR SAY: Student Enrolment Priorities

Student enrolment priorities determine the order in which students will get into a school when space is limited. The Greater Victoria School District is seeking public input through an online survey about what is important to parents and what is most important when prioritizing how students are accepted when space is limited. The survey is available at www.sd61.bc.ca until Monday, April 10, 2017 at 4 pm.

Long term enrolment projections indicate that the Greater Victoria School District could see an increase of 2,000 students over the next 10 years. Although it is anticipated that Greater Victoria's 47 schools can accommodate the projected increase of overall students, some schools will be challenged to accommodate the demand for catchment students, as well as choice. As certain neighbourhoods grow and demographics change, some schools are experiencing pressures already.

Under the School Act, the School District is required to articulate student enrolment priorities in a policy approved by the Board of Education. A Transfer and Registration Committee made up of staff, parents, and Trustees has been established to review the current priorities, seek public input and make recommendations to the Board in May 2017. The student enrolment priorities determined in this process will apply to kindergarten registration, French Immersion and requests for transfer to a non-catchment school.

The Greater Victoria School District is seeking input from parents as part of a review of the current priorities and the overall registration and transfer process. This does not apply to Programs of Choice at higher grade levels (eg. Flex, Challenge, and sports academies)
