# Take Spring Break to Round Up Extra Books

A community that values and shares literacy is a community that prospers. Every young child who is read to before starting school is more likely to see reading and learning as pleasant and achievable. In just over four years, you have been part of sending thousands of books into homes and in helping over 1000 children per month join that invaluable literacy club.

Please take spring break to check the corners of your house and continue to donate books into the pink bin just outside the library.

#### **Staying Healthy**

We are experiencing a lot of colds and flu for students, their families and staff. Please talk with your child about the importance of proper hand washing and coughing/sneezing into their elbow.

#### How to Wash Hands:

Wet hands under warm running water

Scrub with plain soap for a count of 20, all over hands and between fingers

Rinse under running water for a count of 10

Dry hands with a clean paper towel

**Turn** off taps with a paper towel

If your child has been home, or goes home from school with a fever or has been vomiting or has diarrhea, it is suggested that they be free from symptoms for a minimum of 24 hours before returning to school. If your child has been up in the night with any of these symptoms, please do your best to make arrangements for them to stay home until it is certain they have been healthy for at least 24 hours. This will hopefully lessen the spread of illness throughout the school.
