Student Class Placement 2019 –20 School Year

Class Placement for 2019-2020

In May, we will begin to place our students in tentative classes for 2019 – 2020. These class organizations may change prior to school starting, but they give us a beginning place for organizing classes for next year. There are many factors that teachers consider in class placement; Eagle View staff put a lot of thought and effort into this process.

At this time of year, we invite parents to provide us with input that we may not be aware of, such as a child's particular learning style. **Please do not request a specific teacher**. For each student we consider the following when placing him/her in a class:

- social setting including friends, positive and negative relationships;
- size of class (number of children);
- number of years the child has been with the teacher;
- maturity of the child;
- work habits, level of independence;
- ability and willingness to undertake a leadership role;
- intellectual growth;
- > learning style factors (if we are aware).

We would like to emphasize that parents' input is respected whenever it is organizationally and educationally feasible, but that it is not always possible to do so. Though we will begin class building this spring, all lists must be considered temporary and confidential until the first week of September, when we can confirm numbers and staffing.

If you have input that you would like us to consider when placing your child in a class for next year, we must receive written input from you by May 10th. Please address your letters or emails to Lois Bender or lbender@sd61.bc.ca.
