- Disrespect self, others or the school
- Show irresponsibility
- Create unsafe conditions
- Discriminate against race, colour, ancestry, religion, family status, marital status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression & age

Special consideration and planning may apply to students with unique needs who are unable to comply with expectations for various reasons.

Restricted Items & Areas

- Electronic gaming devices, cameras, Pokémon cards or trading cards.

- Increasing responsibility

Consequences

Consequences are the responses to unacceptable conduct.

Consequences...

- are based on the type, severity and frequency of unacceptable conduct
- will be appropriate for the situation
- will be appropriate for the student's age, maturity and special needs

We strive to create the conditions for every person to fix their mistake(s) and to return to the group strengthened.

Responses to unacceptable conduct...

- Thirty second intervention
- Removal from the situation
- Debrief with primary adult
- Conference with VP/Principal
- Student incident report
- Conflict Resolution
- Develop plan to fix mistake
- Parental contact
- Playground Restriction
- Home or School suspension

Special consideration and planning may apply to students with unique needs who are unable to comply with expectations for various reasons.

Notification

Serious unacceptable behavior can result in advising...

- Parents of offender
- Parents of victim
- District officials as required by policy
- Police/other agencies as required by law



Retaliation Prevention

- The Board of Education will take all reasonable steps to prevent retaliation against a student who has made a complaint of a breach of a code of conduct.
