Welcome & Introductions

Principal's Report

- Ready, Step, Roll Update Kindness Assembly on February 28th at 1:15. All welcome. There will be a presentation to the bus drivers and crossing guards. We also have the "Bus Ready" Ambassador program coming in May for all classes.
- Staffing Update Ms. Dann is the acting VP, Mr. Webb moved from Kindergarten on Fridays to Full time in Division 4 (grade ²/₃) just before Christmas Break. Ms. Krytor accepted the Friday Kindergarten job and has been with us for the last two Fridays. We just got an additional EA who started with us yesterday, Belle Kroeger.
- Student Learning Survey for parents of grade 4 students: The Ministry of Education sends the survey out every year to grades 4, 7 and 10 parents which was forwarded from the office using school messenger.
- Red, White and Pink Day on February 14th. Students will be doing activities in various classrooms between recess and lunch. This is drop-in/choice style.
- The district Indigenous Education Department liaison person will be in our school every Tuesday afternoon until the end of the year.
- Flood update All has been restored except for one light fixture and some painting. Our facilities staff did an amazing job and great thanks to View Royal for the amount of water that they pushed into the drain that night.
- Reading and Writing Goals We have made a large purchase of readers for all our students and teachers are still wanting more. The district has committed to give our school some additional money to increase our reading collection along with a district learning teacher who is assigned to support us with our goals.
- IXL continues to be used in the school along with RAZKIDs for additional practice and support for reading at home and school. Thank you for making this happen. 96% of our grade 4/5's were on track in both reading and writing at the end of the first term. 88% of our grade 1-3's were on track. Lots to celebrate after working with these goals for the past 3 years.
