### Kindergarten Registration - September 2025

Planning is already underway for Kindergarten registration. Children turning 5 years old in the calendar year 2025 are eligible for Kindergarten in September 2025. Registration week is Monday, January 27 through Friday, January 31, 2025.

Please read the following carefully for enrolment priorities as well as the documentation required to register.

Families are asked to register online for their catchment area school during registration week. If you currently have a student at Eagle View and will be registering a Kindergarten student but are <u>not</u> living in the Eagle View catchment you must register online for your catchment school and apply for a transfer to Eagle View.

To register you will need your child's birth certificate, Canadian Passport or landed immigrant authorization. You will need to provide <u>two</u> of the following documents for proof of residency (driver's license and utility bills will no longer be accepted):

<u>Home owners</u> <u>Renters</u>

purchase agreement of home rental agreement signed by landlord &

current property tax statement 2 of the following:

home owner's insurance Canadian bank or credit card statement

notice of assessment BC vehicle registration

a purchase agreement (w/subject removal & deposit receipt) income tax statement

renter insurance documents

### Student Transfer Process - K-12

Eagle View Elementary is part of the Spectrum Family of Schools. Catchment students will move through our family of schools – Eagle View Elementary (K-5), Colquitz Middle School (6 – 8), and Spectrum Community School (9-12). Non-catchment students in Grade 5 will be pre-transitioned to their catchment school. Each year as part of the registration process, parents are given an opportunity to apply for transfer if they wish their child to attend a school outside of their assigned catchment. The student transfer process for K – 12 will begin on February 10 – 13, 2025. Transfer forms will be available at any Greater Victoria School District school as well as online. ### Winter Weather - Important Information

It is that time of year when there is the possibility of snow and inclement weather. The School District carefully monitors the forecast and local weather conditions and in the event of any extreme winter conditions, the School District will assess the impacts to school openings or closures and transportation, including school buses. Road conditions and safety considerations are a top priority when faced with inclement weather challenges.

If inclement weather conditions change throughout a school day, the School District may be required to make announcements during the day regarding an early dismissal or a school closure. In the event of an early dismissal or school closure, staff at your child's school will notify families through their regular communication processes and a notice will be posted on the School District website.

If inclement weather conditions worsen overnight, the School District aims to make a determination of school closures by 6:30 a.m. to allow families time to adjust plans. If schools are closed, an alert will appear on the School District's website.
