Principal's Report

- The school's new Vice President will be Christina Chase.
- Mrs. Davis will be leaving at the end of the year, with other staffing changes still pending.
- The grade 4 and 5 entrepreneur's fair will take place on June 13th. The kids will be practicing their financial planning and business literacy skills by making and selling a product at the fair. Parents are welcome, and both kids and parents can purchase things at the fair.
- The junior Canucks are coming next week to do floor ball for divisions 1 to 7, and will be leaving us with some new equipment.
- Requests for IXL subscriptions are in, with all teachers requesting math, but only a few licenses are needed for literature in the accessible learning room.
- The district code of conduct for k-12 is changing to a common standard from the previous individual school codes.
 - The final draft will not be out in time to be included in student planners but will be available online.
 - Feedback on he code of content is welcome.
- Enrollment is close to full for next year.

Fundraising and Fun Lunch

- Fun lunch is almost wrapped for the year.
 - Orders were generally 50-90 kids per lunch.
 - The old grades order more than the younger grades. –
 - Participation is never anywhere close to 100% but is usually at least 50% participation.
- The organizers of the Family Values Coupon book reached out for next year.
 - Lisa Shortt will set up but needs help running it.

Upcoming Events

The Spring Fair will be held on May 30th.

- A separate planning committee will meet to finalize details, but the general format will be unchanged from last year, with a few additions.
- The fire department is sending out a fire truck to attend. They will reach out to Jana Relf for information on where to park.
- Parent volunteers will be doing face painting.
- There will be a small maket with 6-7 local vendors coming, who will set up outside (weather permitting; the gym will be used as an alternate location).
- There will be a silent auction held in the gym; donations from parents and local businesses are being sought and can be left in the office.
- There will be no charge for admission, but the PAC will be selling tickets for food.
- There will potentially be cotton candy available.
- There has been a suggestion for a donation station set up near ticket sales for donation to the PAC.
- Teacher appreciation day is coming up on June 19th.
 - The PAC sponsors a lunch event, with the last few years supplying platters ordered from red barn.
 - The budget for this event is currently \$460.
 - Jess Velikovsky has volunteered to take on the organization of the event.

Other Business

- Jimmy Lau attended the VCPAC general meeting on behalf of the Eagle View PAC.
 - 23 schools sent representatives; the meeting resulted in the election of a new VCPAC executive.
- Mr. Rutherford's grade 5 end of year school trip is short on funds, and asked if there were more funds available over and above the amount already allocated by the PAC.
 - There was a suggestion to allow the grade 5 students to do more fundraising at the spring fair.
 - Although no general funding was offered, the PAC considered having extra funds available for students in need. Susan Hensen motioned to have \$1000 of extra funding available for this purpose, with Jimmy Lau seconding. The motion passed.
- Summer child care can post about opportunities on the community bulletin board, usually by requesting through the office.
- The June assembly coming up, and the PAC requests notice on any opcoming retirements so the PAC can purchase farewell gifts.

Budget Review

- There are still current expenses pending, but the majority of funds for the year have been spent and the budget presented represents a good estimate of our expenses during the past school year. Changes to the proposed budget include:
 - Kindergarten orientation budget has been increased from \$75 to \$100.
 - The Gifts/Teacher Appreciation budget has been increased from \$500 to \$600.
 - Grade 5 year end funds have been changed to \$1500, based on \$25 per student.
 - The class funds and enrichment funds line items have been changed from to a flat amount per student, to better serve classes of varying sizes.
 - Class funds have been changed to \$2950 (based on \$10/student)
 - Enrichment funds have been changed to \$2950 (based on \$10/student).
 - School Arts and Cultural events have been changed from \$1000 to \$1600.
 - Principal's emergency fund has been changed from\$150 to \$200.
 - The Students in Need fund has been changed from \$750 to \$2500.
 - Physical Education has been changed from \$500 to \$1000.
 - The EA budget has been changed from \$200 to \$300.
- The total updated budget for the 2025-2026 school year is \$25,300. Jimmy Lau motioned to accept the proposed budget, with Santina Spencer seconding. The motion passed.
