June 11th, 2025

Principle's Report

- Spring Fair was a success, with thanks to the PAC for organizing.

Financial Update

- The library usually does a presentation with funding (\$500) for the PAC, but was unable to this year, and Ms. Restell requested to hold the funds for next year. PAC consented.
- The final amounts from the Spring Fair are still being calculated but will likely be around \$2000 after reimbursements.
- Most expenses to the budget have been paid, with the last few incoming soon.
- Changeovers for the sponsors of the PAC's accounts is pending: sponsors are required to have an account with Coast capital.

Year End

- Jess and Meredith will do a teacher appreciation lunch event on June 19th, with a budget of \$500
- Kristina will be removing emergency kits and handing them back, as well as checking on the expiry dates of emergency foods on June 19th.
 - Susan will assist and take over the role for next year.
- The year end assembly is coming up on June 20th.
 - Trish Smith is retiring, and the PAC will be getting her a gift.
 - Jess will investigate putting together a farewell video.
 - Jana will get flowers for the teachers leaving Eagle View this year.
- The annual Beckwith Park whole school field trip is coming up on the 23rd of June.
 - Shawn will be doing BBQing, with Jess bringing a propane tank.
 - Susan has volunteered to do an arts and crafts table if it would be helpful.

Next Year

- Santina has created a new information sheet for members of the PAC with information on fundraisers and when events are generally held

Other

- The next VPAC meeting has been deferred to September.
- No bike rack has been put in, but there should be follow up in September.
- Some suggestions from parents included:
 - Jess suggested setting up a garden in the unused area at the back of the school; Jana mentioned there was a garden at one point but it requires significant maintenance and commitment from staff and parents. There has been some staff investigation into new possibilities for a garden through ADST (applied design skills and technology), but this is still in the early stages.
 - Amber suggested looking in to a stem program offered by University of Victoria that brings “stem in a box” to classrooms. Kathy suggests this might be the Science Ventures program the school has already participated in, but Amber will investigate further.
